Eligibility: Nurses who have completed the Provincial Standardized Chemotherapy and Biotherapy (PSCB) Course.

Prerequisite: *Provincial Standardized Chemotherapy and Biotherapy (PSCB)* is required before completing this course.

A. COURSE DESCRIPTION

This self-directed, eLearning course has been designed for nurses who have passed de Souza Institute's Provincial Standardized Chemotherapy and Biotherapy Course. de Souza Institute recommends successful completion of the Chemotherapy Competency Maintenance course (CCMD) every 12-24 months to meet competency maintenance requirements recommended by the Canadian Association of Nurses in Oncology (CANO/ACIO). This maintenance course covers the following topics: assessment and order verification, administration and documentation, safe handling, chemotherapy, biotherapy, immediate complications, sexuality and fertility. Updates on new evidence and new therapies will be highlighted.

Reflective practice is an essential part of nursing practice, professional development, and continuing competence reporting for practice permits. As such, it is integrated into the course and contains the following five steps: assessment, peer feedback, development of a learning plan, implementation of a learning plan and an evaluation of the learning experience.

Several reflective practice tools have been developed to assist you and are accessible through this course. The tools have been designed to be consistent with the Canadian Nursing Regulator's (e.g., CNO and CRNA) annual Quality Assurance Program, CANO/ACIO standards, and provincial standards (e.g., CCO). Refer to Appendix A for list of Canadian Nursing Regulators. These tools may be integrated within your annual portfolio for your regulatory nursing college, and within your organization's annual competency maintenance processes.

Prerequisites: To enroll in the course, participants must be nurses who have successfully completed the Provincial Standardized Chemotherapy and Biotherapy course.

B. COURSE OBJECTIVES

By the end of this course, you will be able to:

- Describe the assessment interview including data collection and communication principles and techniques
- Compare and contrast several assessment tools used in the care of the patient with cancer.
- Summarize and apply the essential steps for chemotherapy and biotherapy administration in case scenarios, including the essential components of documentation.
- Demonstrate evidenced-based principles for safe handling of hazardous drugs, including demonstrating appropriate application of Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) and management of a hazardous drug spill.
- State the use of the different classes of chemotherapy agents and describe the common toxicities of cell cycle and non-cell cycle specific agents.
- Explain the use of biological and molecular targeted therapies and describe their unique toxicities.
- Summarize the nursing assessment, management and support for common toxicities, adverse events and symptoms experienced by patients receiving chemotherapy and/or biotherapy.

C. MODE OF LEARNING: eLearning

The eLearning environment fosters a self-directed approach. You can progress through the modules and exercises at a convenient time, at home or work. The course timetable, in **Section G** of the course syllabus, outlines our suggested weekly expectations for participants.

- <u>eLearning Modules</u>: Sections and modules were developed by the de Souza education team to reflect the latest knowledge in cancer chemotherapy nursing care. The content is up-to-date and includes interactive application exercises and references to the latest clinical guidelines.
- **Supplemental Readings:** These readings are intended to enhance the eLearning content surrounding key topic areas and are *not* required. They can be utilized to address knowledge gaps identified in your self-reflection activities.
- **<u>Study Guide</u>**: A writable study guide is made available as a resource that you can print and/or fill in as you progress through the interactive course modules.

D. MODES OF EVALUATION

As part of the evaluation process, you are required to complete the following:

- <u>A Baseline Participant Survey</u>: This survey obtains your demographics and assesses your knowledge, attitude, and confidence before you begin the eLearning modules for the course.
- <u>eLearning Modules</u>: You must complete all sections/modules by the course end date. Supplemental readings are not required.
- <u>Reflective Practice Tools</u>: A self-assessment tool is provided and is based on CANO/ACIO Standards, Benner's model from Novice to Expert (including strengths and areas to improve) and the CNO Quality Assurance Program. This tool can be printed from the eLearning course to keep in your portfolio. It can be accessed under the section titled "Reflective Practice". Additionally, it is recommended that you create a learning plan and track your ongoing education to support your competency maintenance.
- Exam: There are 20 multiple choice questions in the exam. You will be given 50 minutes to complete the exam. To successfully pass the exam, you must obtain a minimum of 16 out of 20 (>80%). If you do not achieve a passing grade, you should review your exam results and identify knowledge gaps. The course facilitator can provide you with feedback on your exam attempt and assist with knowledge gaps. A one-week time period is recommended between re-writing the exam, to ensure time for review of knowledge gaps. There are maximum 2 attempts for the exam.
- <u>Course Evaluation</u>: At the end of the course, you will be required to complete a "Participant Post Survey" where you can provide your feedback on whether the content met your professional learning needs.

When you have met the all of the above requirements, you will receive **5 learning hours** and an email containing instructions on how to download your certificate of completion via your "My Account".

Please note: this course is considered a non-credit course; therefore completion does not earn you credits towards de Souza designation.

F. SUGGESTED TIME REQUIREMENT

To be successful in completing this course, you are encouraged to set aside 1 to 2 hours each week to complete the course sections. Learning is primarily self-directed. The total learning hours for this course is 5 hours.

Sections and modules are meant to be completed sequentially but you can choose to go ahead and complete learning activities at your own pace.

Your course activity completion will be reflected in your **grade book**. Evidence of engagement through active participation will result in a positive learning experience. You will be expected to complete all sections/modules through the eLearning course by the course end date.

G.CCMD RENEWAL TIMELINE

All renewals will be on a 24-month cycle. You can find your next 24 month due date on your CCMD course certificate. You will need to complete your CCMD by your 24 month due date/expiry date.
