A. COURSE DESCRIPTION

This 16 week online course will introduce nurses to the art and science of oncology nursing practice. Oncology patients receive care from all health care settings - including acute care teaching hospitals, tertiary care centres, general hospitals and community settings. Given the increasing complexity of this growing patient population, caring for people with cancer and their families involves a particular set of advanced skills and knowledge.

This course will introduce nurses to essential concepts in oncology nursing practice and provide fundamental information to those who work with oncology patients.

Although learners can complete the various components of the course at their own pace, the course must be completed in its entirety within sixteen weeks of the course start date (this date can be found on the course information page in My Account).

B. COURSE OBJECTIVES

By the end of this course, you will be able to:

- Explain cell biology and genetics in both the cancer process and throughout all stages of the cancer trajectory
- Summarize the disease process for the major types of cancers in Canada
- Compare and contrast the various oncologic emergencies and associated manifestations of symptoms
- Describe the psychosocial impact of cancer including screening for distress, sexuality and survivorship issues
- Discuss six common symptoms of cancer and its treatment (fatigue, nausea and vomiting, constipation, diarrhea, myelosuppression and peripheral neuropathy)

C. MODE OF LEARNING: eLearning

The eLearning environment fosters a self-directed approach. You can progress through the modules and exercises at a convenient time, at home or work. The course timetable in Section H on pages 6-8 of the course syllabus outlines weekly expectations for participants.

- Learning and application: Sections and modules were developed by the de Souza education team to reflect the latest knowledge in Oncology Practice. The content is up-to-date and includes interactive application exercises and links to the latest clinical guidelines.
- Study Guides: Each course section has a printable study guide that you can print and fill in as you progress through the interactive course modules.

D. MODES OF EVALUATION

As part of the evaluation process, you are required to complete the following:

- A baseline evaluation: this survey assesses your knowledge, attitude, and confidence before you begin the eLearning modules for the course.
- eLearning modules/units/sections, required readings, and tests.
- Knowledge assessment (participants must complete the following):
 - Sections 1-4

Participants must complete a 35 question quiz with a score of at least 70%.

Participants will have a maximum of two attempts for this guiz.

Section 5 (Cancer Sites)

Participants must complete guizzes with a score of at least 70% in each of the four disease sites.

Participants will have a maximum of two attempts per quiz.

Section 6 (Symptom Management)

Participants must complete guizzes with a score of at least 70% in each of the six case studies.

Participants will have a maximum of two attempts per quiz.

Section 7 (Oncological Emergencies)

Participants must complete a 15 question guiz with a score of at least 80% (12/15 questions = 80%).

Participants will have a maximum of two attempts for this guiz.

 Post evaluation: At the end of the course, you will be required to complete the online post course evaluation through eLearning.

When you have successfully met all the above requirements, within two business days, you will receive an email containing instructions on how to download your certificate of completion and will receive credit towards obtaining your de Souza designation.

F. TIME REQUIREMENT AND EXPECTATIONS FOR PARTICIPANTS

To be successful in completing this course, you are encouraged to set aside 2 to 3 hours each week to complete each section as learning is primarily self-directed. The total learning hours for this course is 40 hours.

Sections and modules are to be completed sequentially; participants can choose to go ahead and complete learning activities in multiple sections and modules at once, however, all course requirements must be completed within 16 weeks.

Your course activity completion will be reflected in your grade book. You will be expected to complete all seven sections/ modules through the eLearning system. It is strongly recommended for participants not to plan a vacation during the course period.

Donalda has been an oncology nurse for 50 years working in both inpatient and outpatient units. She has been a primary nurse in lung and GI oncology as well as worked in the chemotherapy suite. For the last 10 years of her clinical career, she has been the solo instructor for the Sinai C.A.R.E. Cancer Care education series that she and her chemo colleagues developed targeting nurses new to oncology. She has been an educator at de Souza for the past 15 years. Donalda has served on the board of directors for the Canadian Association of Nurses in Oncology for 7 years. Donalda holds certification in oncology from the CNA. She has done item writing and exam review for the CNA Oncology Certification Exam. Donalda was nominated by her oncology peers and was one of 100 nurses from across Canada to receive the CNA Centennial Award honoring her work in education of novice oncology nurses. In 2014 she received the Lifetime Achievement Award from the Canadian Association of Nurses in Oncology. She was the recipient of the Pfizer Award of Excellence in Education in 2023.

Margaret Forbes, RN-EC, MN, NP-Adult, CON(C)

Margaret is a nurse practitioner with more than 30 years of oncology experience. She recently practiced as a nurse practitioner in complex malignant hematology including stem cell transplant and cellular therapies at the Juravinski Hospital and Cancer Centre. Margaret also has clinical experience in the treatment and management of people with solid tumour malignancies, specifically breast cancer. Margaret has held various nursing leadership roles most recently as a nurse practitioner lead in complex malignant hematology. She was the clinical lead in the development of the cancer survivorship program at the Juravinski Cancer Centre. In 2016, Margaret was the recipient of the Canadian Association of Nurses in Oncology (CANO-ACIO) Pfizer Award of Excellence in Nursing Leadership. In 2018, Margaret led the development of the Ron and Nancy Clark Nurse Practitioner Fellowship in Hematology at the Juravinski Hospital and Cancer Centre. Margaret has participated in research as both a co-principal investigator and co-investigator in multiple studies. Margaret is an assistant clinical professor at McMaster University School of Nursing. She has recently joined the de Souza Institute as an advanced practice nurse educator. Margaret believes that a strong foundation in oncology knowledge will inspire nurses and other health care providers to become confident, competent and enthusiastic about providing excellence in the care of people and their families who experience cancer.

Authors Philiz Goh, RN, MN, CON(C) – Oncologic Emergencies

Philiz began her nursing career in a surgical oncology inpatient unit at Sunnybrook Health Sciences Centre and moved into the outpatient setting to care for breast cancer patients in all stages of their cancer journey, including medical, surgical, radiation, survivorship and palliative.
