A. COURSE DESCRIPTION

The Dyspnea Symptom Management course is a collaboration between Cancer Care Ontario (CCO) and de Souza Institute. This course consists of three online modules promoting an evidence-based wholistic approach to dyspnea care. The content and structure of the course is based on *Cancer Care Ontario's Guide-to-Practice: Dyspnea*.

The following areas are covered by the online modules:

- Emotional impact and meaning of dyspnea
- Etiology and pathophysiology of dyspnea
- · Incidence and prevalence of dyspnea
- Anatomy and physiology of the respiratory system
- Screening and comprehensive assessment of dyspnea
- Symptoms and underlying medical conditions
- Non-pharmacological approaches to the management of dyspnea including day-to-day strategies to help with shortness of breath
- Pharmacological interventions

The course is designed for front line multidisciplinary providers, including family physicians; nurses; and allied health care providers. Participants will have **four weeks** to complete the course.

B. COURSE OBJECTIVES

The course covers core competencies outlined in the CCO symptom management guideline for dyspnea management. The course also includes foundational knowledge in dyspnea management and patient education.

By the end of this course, you will be able to:

- Define dyspnea and explain the etiology of cancer related dyspnea.
- Explain common themes and impacts of dyspnea and explain the importance of a wholistic approach in assessment and management.
- Outline the physiology of breathing and pathophysiology of dyspnea.
- Identify the importance of using evidence based tools to assess dyspnea.
- List risk factors that contribute to dyspnea.
- Explain methods and tools used for screening and assessment of dyspnea (for cancer patients).
- List tests that may be utilized to determine underlying cause(s) of dyspnea.

- List the major non-pharmacological and pharmacological approaches for the management and treatment of dyspnea.
- Apply patient education principles to promote patient participation in treatment.

C. MODE OF LEARNING

The main mechanisms to facilitate learning in this course will entail eLearning.

eLearning

The eLearning environment fosters a self-directed approach for participants to progress through the modules at a convenient time, either at home or work.

- <u>Learning and application.</u> Sections and modules are developed by the content expert and de Souza education team to reflect the latest knowledge in the assessment and management of dyspnea. The content is up to date and the learning format is interactive.
- Technical support will be provided throughout the course.

D. MODES OF EVALUATION

As part of the evaluation process, you are required to complete the following:

- A baseline evaluation: this survey assesses your knowledge, attitude, confidence, and learning methods before you begin the eLearning modules for the course.
- eLearning modules: It is expected that you will complete all activities, case studies within all the modules.
- Exit Exam: You have to complete a multiple choice exam with a passing grade of 80%.
- Post Evaluation: At the end of the course, you will be required to complete the online post course evaluation through eLearning.

When you have successfully met all the above requirements, you will receive an email containing instructions on how to download your certificate of completion, and will receive credit towards obtaining your de Souza designation.

E. EXPECTATIONS FOR PARTICIPANTS

To be successful in completing this course, you are encouraged to set aside 2 to 3 hours each week to complete each section as learning is primarily self-directed. The total learning hours for this course is 7 hours.

Your course activity completion will be reflected in your grade book. You will be expected to complete all sections/modules through the eLearning system.

F. COURSE TIMELINE

All sections/modules are to be completed within the four week course offering time period.
